
"It's scary, period," Gardiner said. "Every time we walk into a room, building, we don't know what we're going to encounter. It's a whole level of something new." Then – moments after the man being treated by paramedics came to – the overdose bit.

"My face felt like it was burning. I felt extremely light-headed. I felt like I was getting dizzy," he said. "I stood there for two seconds and thought, 'Oh my God, I didn't just get exposed to something.' I just kept thinking about the carfentanil."

Carfentanil came to mind because just hours earlier, Phillips' boss,
Harford County Sheriff Jeffrey Gahler, sent an email to deputies
saying the synthetic opioid so powerful that it's used to tranquilize

report from a fatal overdose in the county. The sheriff had urged









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

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), in its recommendations for preventing occupational exposure to fentany and other opioids, outlines safe operating procedures, risk assessment, training, decontamination and PPE guidelines for potentially exposed emergency responders



"The US National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH, Centers for Disease Control) published a bulletin addressing potential danger to law enforcement, public health workers, and first responders who may be exposed to fentanyl or its analogs. Citing an absence of empirical evidence, the NIOSH bulletin recommended use of a P100-rated respirator, nitrile gloves, and eye protection. For personnel performing tasks that may aerosolize fentanyl, the NIOSH bulletin recommended dermal protection such as coveralls or protective sleeves."
